Work with your flight team to retrieve an airplane black box during a water rescue training exercise. Design and paint an aircraft, take flight ground school, meet experts in the aviation field, and so much more. By the end of the week, you will learn to pilot a real aircraft from Dayton Wright Brothers Airport in Miamisburg under the direction and support of an FAA certified pilot instructor.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Air Camp?

Air Camp is a hands-on, education program in the Dayton area that works to inspire students at the intermediate and middle school levels to learn more about science, technology, engineering, and mathematics through aviation and aeronautics. The goal is to encourage youth to achieve their potential, develop critical-thinking and problem-solving skills, and pursue education and careers in STEM related fields.

What are some ways to help with the cost?

Campers who participate in the Girl Scout Cookie Program can earn money to use towards the \$600 Air Camp cost.

Cookie Dough Earned	# of Packages Sold
\$5	170+
\$6	200+
\$7	230+
\$8	300+
\$10	400+
\$20	500+

Cookie Dough, up to the 500+ level is cumulative, so a camper who sold 500 boxes of cookies would have \$96 to put towards camp.

If a camper sells 1250+ packages she can earn a \$300 camp credit.

Girl Scouts of Western Ohio also has financial aid available for campers in need.

How much time will my camper spend traveling during the week?

Campers will leave camp every morning after breakfast and travel to the greater Dayton area. Girls will spend their day participating in Air Camp activities at local universities and aviation sites. The number of sites visited daily depends on the time required to meaningfully engage students in each immersive activity planned. Campers will return to Camp Whip Poor Will for dinner at 6:00pm.

Will my camper get any traditional camp experiences?

This is a highly immersive program where campers will spend the majority of their time participating in program specific activities. However girls will still participate in open and closing campfire, daily flag ceremonies, breakfast & dinner at dining hall.

Does my camper have to fly?

No. As with all camp activities, piloting an airplane will be challenge by choice. Campers who want to and have approval of their caregivers may choose to do so. If either the camper or their caregiver is uncomfortable with this part of the program the camper can opt out.

What if there is bad weather on flight day?

If campers are unable to fly due to weather, they will receive a flight voucher that can be redeemed up to one year later.
