Subject: Antiracism Book Discussion

At the September board meeting, the new formed Antiracism Advisory Committee suggested that we begin our journey together by reading and discussing two books:

- 1. White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism by Robin Diangelo available on Amazon for \$9.60
- 2. How To Be An Antiracist by Ibram X. Kendi available on Amazon for \$16.20

We will begin with *White Fragility* at our November 17 board meeting. Since the time will be limited, we have scheduled a "Part 2" discussion on this book on December 8, 4:00-6:00 pm. To prepare for the discussions in November and December, we are attaching a study guide (Attachment E), which may help you as you read the book.
