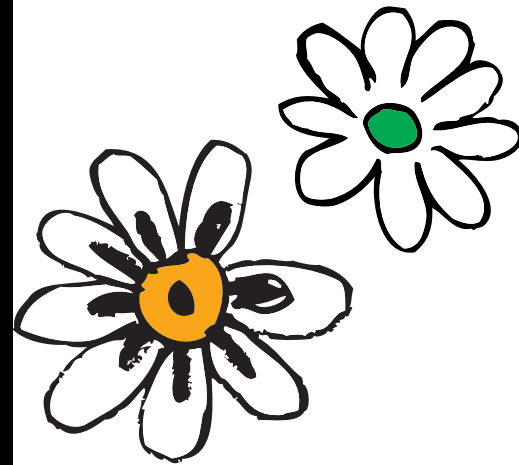

Badges & Petals

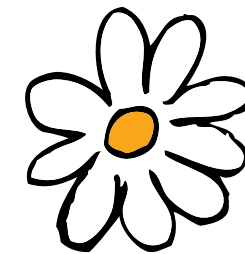
Badges offer girls the chance to try new things and develop specific skills, from inventing to hiking to camping to managing money.

Leadership Journeys

Girls gain leadership skills and dive deeper into topics that are relevant to them, through project-based, multidisciplinary learning adventures that help them team up to identify and solve problems in their communities.

Program Events

With hundreds of program events offered throughout the year, girls have many opportunities to engage their passions and try new things.



Troop Money Earning

Troops and individual Girl Scouts participate in the fall nuts and candy sale and the Girl Scout Cookie Program to build key business skills and help offset costs for membership, program supplies, uniforms, activities, camp, and travel trips.

Community Service

Girl Scouts strive to change their communities and the world in meaningful ways through short-term community service projects and longer-term Take Action projects.

Camping

Camping is a great way for girls to explore leadership, build skills, and develop a deep appreciation for nature. Exciting resident, day, and troop adventure camp options are available for all ages.

Girl Scouts do A LOT!

Girl Scout activities are easy to participate in and teach skills that will benefit your daughter throughout her lifetime. Guided by supportive adults and peers, she will participate in the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, a collection of programs and activities designed to help her **Discover** who she is and what she cares about; **Connect** who she is and what she values to things outside of herself; and **Take Action** to make the world a better place.

COSTS OF GIRL SCOUTS



A Great Value!

Girl Scouts is a great value! Talk to your troop leader now about expenses you can anticipate for the coming year.

Membership Fee (\$25/year)

Every girl and volunteer who participates in Girl Scouts is required to become a member of the organization. The membership fee, which is sent to our national organization, covers the cost of fundamental services that support the Girl Scout Movement as well as accident insurance for members participating in approved Girl Scout activities.

Troop Dues (\$20-60/year)

Troops may charge moderate dues to pay for supplies and badges.



Uniform (\$33 - \$46/year)

Uniforms are recommended but not required, and many girls enjoy wearing them to display their badges. There is a uniform for each grade level, and one uniform can be used for up to two years.

Girl Scout Books (\$7 - \$22/year)

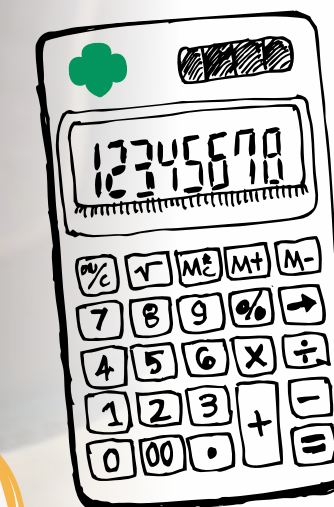
A variety of books are available to support programming in troops.

Special Programs (Varies)

When not covered by the troop, special programs, such as field trips or workshops, are generally paid for individually. Examples include camping trip supplies or fees to go to a Girl Scout program event.

Cookie Program

The Girl Scout Cookie Program not only gives girls funds for the troop, but it also supports all of our services to volunteers, parents, and girls.

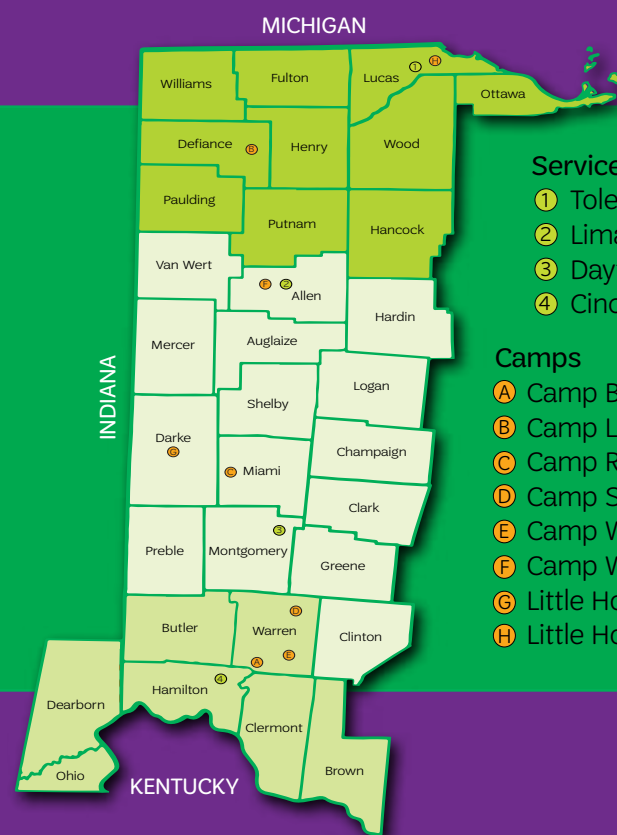
